#### **Events during the Agriculture Conference 2020**

On the initiative of the Professional Group Herbs and medicinal plants, a **three-day workshop** on the subject of "Herb-growing between beauty and utility" will be held with Ola Aukrust and Christina Spieß. In this interactive workshop, the topic of the Conference will be referred to on one hand, and on the other hand the relationship between humans and plants will play an important role. Ola Aukrust will give an insight into the cultivation of herbs on his farm in Norway, while Christina Spieß will deal with the subject from an ethnological perspective. ### Company portrait: Biodynamic herbs from Krebsbachhof (D)

Following the report by our Norwegian Demeter herb grower Ola Aukrust in our last newsletter, excerpts from a report by Bettina Billmann on the Krebsbachhof in Lohra-Seelbach near Marburg are now to follow. The complete version can be found in the report about the summer excursion 2019 at <a href="www.netzwerk-kraeuter.de">www.netzwerk-kraeuter.de</a> : "As they founded their Demeter farm in 1987, Peter Heuner and his colleagues decided to cultivate herbs, next to grassland and cereals, due to the stony soils and dry climate conditions. Of the now 106 hectares of arable land and grassland, the area for medicinal and aromatic herbs has levelled off to around 8 hectares, and the

same amount of land is used for seed production for Bingenheimer Saatgut AG. Due to the special requirements of these crops, the herbs can only be partially integrated into the crop rotation of the rest of the farm.

The range of medicinal and aromatic herbs currently includes calendula, arnica, tarragon, St. John's wort, yarrow, nettle, cornflower, kidney vetch and chamomile. For seed multiplication, buckwheat, phacelia, chives, savory, cornflower, calendula, arnica and crimson clover are cultivated alternately with St. John's wort, rocket, chervil and chamomile, among others, as the customer does not need seed from all crops every year. The farm's own arnica variety was taken over from the Botanical Garden in Marburg a good 30 years ago and over the years adapted to the location as best as possible through own selection and multiplication.

The herbs are sold primarily to companies which are active in the tea or pharmaceutical sector, as the production quantities are too small for the natural cosmetics sector".

In July 2019, Peter Heuner and his family handed over the business to their successor Karl Meßing, who had been working for the company for five years.
