## Die weltweite biodynamische Bewegung stellt sich vor

Seit 1924, als Rudolf Steiner in Koberwitz die Vorträge des Landwirtschaftlichen Kurses hielt und damit die biodynamische Landwirtschaft begründete, hat sich die biodynamische Bewegung weltweit entwickelt. Mittlerweile gibt es auf allen Kontinenten biodynamische Höfe, Gärten, Initiativen, Vereine und Forschungsinstitute. Einige davon nahmen das 100-jährige Jubiläum der biodynamischen Landwirtschaft als Anlass, ein Poster zu gestalten, welches an der Landwirtschaftlichen Tagung vom 7. bis 10. Februar 2024 am Goetheanum in Dornach präsentiert wurde. Die vorliegenden Postersammlung widerspiegelt die vielfältige Entwicklung des biodynamischen Impulses weltweit.

## Introducing the Worldwide Biodynamic Movement

Since 1924, when Rudolf Steiner gave the lectures of the Agriculture Course in Koberwitz and thus founded biodynamic agriculture, the biodynamic movement has developed worldwide. There are now biodynamic farms, gardens, initiatives, associations, and research institutes on every continent. Some took the 100th anniversary of biodynamic agriculture as an opportunity to design a poster to present at the Agriculture Conference from 7 to 10 February 2024 at the Goetheanum in Dornach. This collection of posters reflects the diverse development of the biodynamic impulse worldwide.

### KIM, Jun-Kwon

KIM, Jun-Kwon learned and practiced organic farming in the Pulmuone community, which first started organic farming in Korea in 1976. And He is a founding member of the Jeong Nong Hoe, first organic association of Korea. In 1992, Biodynamics was introduced in Korea to him and to other Korean farmers, by Philiaud Dennes, a farmer from Japan.

### Peace Tree Farm

Since 2005, he has been running a biodynamic farm, Peace Tree Farm, in Yangju until 2009 when he moved the farm to Pocheon. He also founded the Biodynamics Action Research Group in 2005. KIM, Jun-Kwon has been preparing for the Demeter's certification in the near future.

# THE BIODYNAMIC IMPULSE IN MALAYSIA

Malaysia Demeter Association (MDA) is a non-profit, non-religious and non-political organization formed to promote and practice biodynamic agriculture based on Rudolf Steiner's anthroposophy of furthering agriculture on spiritual-scientific foundations in Malaysia and by extension Asia. MDA was registered on the 4th of July 2019 under The Societies' Act 1966 as a Legal Society with a Constitution governed by a board of directors. It has a democratic organizational structure, financial autonomy and its objectives are similar and compatible with International Biodynamic Association (IBDA) and Demeter International (DI).

Dr. Yap Kim Fay was elected as the first President.

MDA became a full member of Biodynamic Federation-Demeter International (BF-DI) and International Biodynamic Associations (IBDA) on 22nd June 2020,



On Oct 2022, MDA and BFDI together, successfully hosted the 1st Asia Pacific Biodynamic Conference held in Raub, Malaysia. This was also supported financially by Goetheanum - Section for Agriculture. MDA currently provides and supports biodynamic trainings and BD preparation making in Malaysia and neighbouring countries in South East Asia.

**Ng Tien Khuan and Ho Woon Sing** are the pioneers of biodynamic farming in Malaysia. They have been practising the Australian Demeter Biodynamic method and conducting seminars for more than 10 years. Started Terra Organic Farm since 2006 and in 2009, they acquired the practices of Biodynamics and today it was developed into 80 acres of vegetables, fruit trees, tea, coffee and oil palm plantation with 30 goats, 5 cows, chicken and ducks. Among them, 50 acres are Demeter certified. They also cultivated full range of plants for Biodynamic preparation in the farm and produced own Biodynamic preparation. In 2018 Tien Khuan and Woon Sing founded Bio-Dynamic Agricultural Association of Malaysia where Thien Khuan also served as an Australian Demeter Biodynamic certification trainer.

In 2023, Terra Farm services and facilities include: Biodynamic and Anthroposophy courses and trainings, advisory support for Biodynamic conversion, farm to table vegetables box for 500-600 families, forest reserved and eco-retreat centre (Terra Tree House), workshop producing red palm cooking oil and a shop selling organic and Biodynamics produces (Red Earth Living).

# Biodynamic Initiatives in Malaysia

## Kongsi Garden

"When we look deeply at a flower, we can see that sun, light, water, earth, mineral, even our consciousness, is inside. A flower cannot be by herself alone. To Be Means To Inter-Be." - Thich Nhat Hanh

**Kongsi Garden**, a rare green acre of garden in the heart of capital city in Malaysia, surrounding the vicinity of Kongsi Co-op, a cooperative which promote sustainable and holistic living through associative economics and educational work.

Started by mood mapping and landscaping work led by Biodynamic gardener Chai Chik Ying in 2022, Kongsi garden humbly set up to serve as a learning garden that connects people with self, nature and society through community gardening, educational activities and research work. Over a year, through Kongsi community effort, the land is now developing into a vegetables, fruit trees, spices and herbs garden, a food forest and a pollinator garden.

In 2023, upon visiting of Biodynamic trainer Harald Hoven from California, a community building workshop from the perspective of Biodynamics was held with fellowship collaboration of Kongsi, Mari Orchard and Steinhaus team. Through community exchange and dialogue, food tasting, nature observation and composting experience at Kongsi Garden, participants deepened connection with principle of Biodynamics and delved into the question: "How can we understand "community" as an inter-be living being?"

## Mari Orchard

**Mari Orchard** is a Biodynamic farm with 18 years of organic and 8 years of Biodynamic cultivation. Leong Yeat Hing and Ling Mei Lee are the current care-taker of the land since their return in 2020 from Biodynamic apprenticeship at Live Power Community Farm, United States. They continue the land cultivation with Biodynamic agriculture and seeing remarkable improvement in the farm harvest over the years, both quantity and quality. It is now a renowned producer of top-quality Biodynamic durian in Malaysia and their signature Biodynamic produces includes too the pineapples, coconuts and bananas.

In 2023, together with fellowship partner Kam Yew Wai from Steinhaus, Mari Orchard started offering youth education for Waldorf school students through experiential farm living. The objective is to cultivate the human-nature relationship and its impact on health into the early teens. In 2023 too, with joint collaboration of fellowship partner Kongsi Co-op and gardening team, Mari Orchard co-organised the first Malaysia Biodynamic trainers and practitioners fellowship gathering, stirring up conversation on challenges faced in local Biodynamic circle and bridging connection between farmers, producers, retailers and consumers over a joyful community meal. The conversation was moderated by Harald Hoven and received warm participation from public and biodynamic practitioners.

## Harmony BD Farm School

**Harmony BD Farm School** (formerly MY BD Agriculture Academy) is a Biodynamic training centre officiated in 2022 by Chin Tieng, Teoh and partners. Mission of the school is to promote Biodynamic agriculture for home gardeners and farmers. He was inspired by his mentor Mr. Jakes Jayakaran in 2018 to embark on a Biodynamic journey, since then Harmony BD Farm school provides Biodynamic trainings for youth, farmers and gardeners, experiential farm tour, Biodynamic preparation workshops and Biodynamic farms advisory and consultation works.



## Centainnel Agriculture

"Only healthy soil can produce healthy and energetic crops!"

**Centainnel Agriculture** founded by Tung Siew Hoe and Goh Shwu Chian in 2012 on an ex-mining white clayish and sandy land. With 8 years of practising crop rotation and planting green manure for soil regeneration through practicing Biodynamics and Shimamoto Microbial agriculture, the 8 acres farm is now producing a variety of good quality sweet potato, leafy vegetables, legumes, gourd and heirloom roots. There is also a range of farm produces such as noodles, dried fruits, turmeric powders that is popular among the locals.



## Jungle Garden Family

"Oneness with Nature - Everything got to happen like nature by itself"



**Ivan Ho** spent his youth tending to an off-grid family farm in the heart of a jungle. His experiences working with the farm, surrounded by wilderness and being within the circle of indigenous communities prompted him to start-up farming and education based on land and life care in 1999.

Ivan initiated Jungle Garden Family in 2018. Since then, a 7 acres of monoculture palm oil plantation has been transformed into a thriving jungle ecological system through the ways of Indigenous Cosmo Agro Ecology. Ivan Ho's inclusive approaches to land care includes Agri-homeopathy, Bio-dynamic Agriculture and Natural Farming. Ivan finds Biodynamic practices that emphasize self consciousness in doing helps bring back the diminishing qualities of indigenous cosmological land care with a modern practical doing. In 2023, Jungle Garden Family services and facilities includes farm advisory support for organic conversion and ecology restoration, awareness retreat, farm to table chicken eggs for 20 families and workshop producing handmade vinegar and honey.






## The Kevin Rohan Memorial Eco Foundation

### Biodynamic Impulse:

KRMEF practices biodynamic farming through holistic nutrient cycles, meaning that the biodynamic compost is produced on the farm with the involvement of farm animals. Additionally, KRMEF works to teach these biodynamic farming practices to communities in other areas of Nepal using a complete biodynamic preparations.



### Ideas for the Future:

Nepal is an agriculture country. As such, KRMEF hopes to spread biodynamic ideas and techniques to as many places and people as possible in order to help make Nepal a completely biodynamic country. With less than one percent of the agricultural land in Nepal certified as organic, KRMEF focuses their efforts on spreading their biodynamic practices in order to help change that.

### Significant Milestones:

In 2013, KRMEF purchased degraded farmland that was previously farmed using pesticides and chemical fertilizer. KRMEF rejuvenated this land by transforming it into a biodynamic farm. KRMEF's biodynamic farming method relies on a holistic, ecological approach to agriculture by focusing on improving soil fertility to produce healthier plants and, in turn, healthier individuals. Additionally, KRMEF gets international students who join the organization to learn biodynamic practices.



### Where KRMEF Stands Today:

KRMEF currently has 53 community members working across different areas of the Foundation. Additionally, the Foundation supports the surrounding community by providing schooling and meals for about 200 students as well as offering medical services to their students and neighbors. This multifold work demonstrates KRMEF's continuing efforts to support and involve the entire community. KRMEF also takes multiple efforts in order to travel around Nepal and teach the biodynamic practices to other areas of the country.



# KOBERWITZ 1924 INC.



## A Cultural and A Healing Impulse in the Philippines

Koberwitz 1924 Inc. was conceived when Walter Siegfried Hahn and Grace Zozobrado-Hahn moved to Palawan in 2009. Palawan is the "last frontier of the Philippines", with great cultural and ecological diversity. Already then it could be foreseen that mining, illegal logging, illegal trade of wild animals and plants, un-informed road building, tourism and strong immigration would threaten the fragile ecological balance on the main island and the 1800 smaller islands of the Palawan archipelago. Inspired by the Koberwitz impulse, Grace and Walter believed that through consciousness-raising and empowerment work, they could contribute to a healthy and sustainable development. Based on their faculties, they identified as core areas of their inspirational and training activities: biodynamic agriculture, life force-filled nutrition, holistic health and age-appropriate education.




## Connecting Man and the Cosmos – Healing the Earth

Koberwitz 1924 Inc. sees biodynamic agriculture as a deep and wide basis for cultural development. It acknowledges and works with the connection to the higher forces within and without, and with healing relationships including with the great being we call MOTHER EARTH.

The work of Koberwitz 1924 is located on farm lands in Puerto Princesa, the capital of Palawan. However, engagements go far beyond Palawan including many locations and partners in the Philippines and several other countries of Asia.

In a country where man-made disasters and natural catastrophes are part of the daily reality, our tasks cover working for the long-term good as much as providing immediate help where and when we can.



- 14 years ago we started with our seedgarden where we grow local resilient root crops and vegetables like Peperomia pellucida, which we try to introduce to the market. 1. we try to adapt vegetable seeds from biodynamic overseas origin, 2. we breed species like corn, 3. we grow seedlings, especially of endemic hardwood trees.

- In our seedgarden and farm we showcase a multi-level tropical farm organism which incorporates the indigenous species originally growing there. We have around 180 cultivated species of vegetables, grains, medicinal plants, and fruit trees. The diversity provides visitors, especially farmers used to monoculture, with an experience that farming can be more in harmony with nature and can also be productive in more holistic ways.

- We make and provide all biodynamic preparations.
- Seedgarden and Farm serve as training grounds for workshops and courses. Individualized courses and advisory work are also done on-site upon request for assistance. Trainings include introductory courses on biodynamic agriculture to BD-preparation making, nutrition, health especially primary care, Waldorf Education, adult learning, and emergency pedagogy. We also have a small sensory experience field.



# BIRTH OF BIODYNAMICS IN INDIA



## Albert Howard / Indore

Sir **Albert Howard** in 1920's developed the first modern method of composting called the Indore method of composting based on the location of this work.



## Peter Proctor / Indore

**Peter Proctor** buried the first cow horn manure preparation in 1993, at a course on Biodynamics at the behest of some followers of Mahatma Gandhi at the exact same location where Sir Albert Howard documented a method of composting, even staying in the same house as Howard. This led to the creation of the largest national biodynamic movement in the world.



## Kodaikanal

In the 1950s, the Biodynamic pioneer Ehrenfried Pfeiffer, a student of Rudolf Steiner's gave a booklet about the use of biodynamic preparations in composting along with some biodynamic preparations to Ms Evelyn Speiden Gregg for her trip to India. She gave this literature and the preparations to some followers of Mahatma Gandhi in Kodaikanal which led to the use of the Biodynamic preparations for the first time in the country. Forty years later a biodynamic course was started at the Sacred Heart College in Kodaikanal by Peter Proctor, which has led to one of the longest running annual biodynamic course in the world since.

In the heart of Southern India's Sevapur, where the Green Revolution's chemicals had left the land barren, a young woman named Anthoniselvi stood tall. Born to a peasant farmer with little land, she became a beacon of change.


Guided by her Guru Jakes Jayakaran, she learned the magic of Biodynamic Farming. For a decade, Selvi journeyed through diverse fields - from nurturing Organic Milk to Empowering Local Women in Biodynamic Farming, Solid Waste Management, and Waldorf Education.

With grit and wisdom, Selvi cultivated a half-acre haven, growing paddy, tomatoes, sweet potatoes, sesame, and caring for cows and goats. Her farm wasn't just fulfilling the needs of her family; it championed fair trade, connecting consumers to healthy food.



She didn't stop at her success. Selvi shared her knowledge, forming alliances with groups like Puvidham, Farm India, Nanban Foundation. Her "Joyful Dynamic Agri-Clinic" became a sanctuary of wisdom for women in the Kadavur region. Moreover, she regularly teaches Agriculture students from Madurai Kamaraj University and Gandhigram Rural University, the BD preparations, Cow Pat Pit and the BD Calendar.



# Biodynamic

## SILK ROAD

İstafil Çiftliği, İstanbul / Türkiye



The city of Istanbul, formerly known as Constantinople, was a major player on the ancient Silk Road. Strategically located between East and West and also the Mediterranean and the Black Sea, Istanbul has always been the "bridge of trade" in Byzantine and Ottoman times and even today. The coastal side called "Eminönü" was the most active market place during the days of the Silk Road. Here you can still find the most powerful and glamorous scents in the Egyptian spice bazaar. İstafil Biodynamic Farm is located just two hours outside the centre of Istanbul and produces Demeter certified vegetables and fruit for the local market. They have cows, chickens and sheep on the farm. In 2018 the Demeter Türkiye Association was founded in this farm and soon after in 2019 the 1st Biodynamic Training and Anthroposophy Centre was started in the country and named it as RUMI Centre. They continue their practical and theoretical work in the farm inspired by the impulse of Rudolf Steiner's Agriculture Course. Rumi Centre is part of the exchange of knowledge between the West and the East.

### Sarouneh P.J.S. Co, Urmia, Iran



Sarouneh factory is located in Urmia city in North west of Iran. Sarouneh is producing Demeter and Organic fruit juice concentrates and purees. They started producing Organic fruit concentrates in 2005 and started the Demeter project in 2016 in Kashan city, in a pomegranate farm. They received their Demeter certificate in 2018. Sarouneh produces "Cloudy Demeter-pomegranate juice concentrate" and it is exported to their client in Germany.

### BRIEF HISTORY

瑞典商人艾瑞克·苏尔支助了浙江的生物动力棉花项目，虽然项目最终未成功，但来自新西兰的彼得·波克特应邀举办了中国第一个生物动力培训项目。

Mr. Erik Sohl, a Swedish businessman, funded a biodynamic cotton program in Zhejiang. Although it failed, Mr. Peter Proctor from New Zealand was invited to give the first BD training program in China.



1990

中国第一家生物动力农场在四川建立，生物动力农夫们种桑养蚕制造生物动力真丝，由德国咨询师奥本海默提供生物动力种植技术的指导。

China's first biodynamic farm was established in Sichuan, focusing on growing mulberry and raising silkworms to produce BD silk, under the guidance of Mr. Julius Obermaier, a German Biodynamic advisor.



1998

In 2010, Phoenix Commune in Beijing became the first biodynamic farm to get Demeter certification. With great support from Thomas Lüthi of Demeter International, Demeter China Association was established in 2011. Dr. Shen Li, Li Yan and Hu Kaipeng, pioneers of China's Biodynamic movement, are the three co-founders of the Association.






## WHAT DID WE DISCOVER IS HAPPENING IN AFRICA?

A reflection via the 7 processes of life?

## 6 Growing - New faculties

Three characteristic forces of living growth in nature are polarity, development, and metamorphosis.

In our Israeli biodynamic work, we see several initiatives that have developed over the years that bring forces of growth:

- The development of a chromatography lab as a continuum process to better understand the biodynamic preparation and its effect.
- The commercial production of cover crops as a means to great local nourishment.
- Winter study intensive events as the development of our studies of biodynamics.
- The redevelopment of a biodynamic cow shade and a 2nd new training center in Harduf brings new polarity.
- Cross-Mediterranean collaboration and exchange are a metamorphosis of our way to meet and develop biodynamics.
- A desert model and research farm at Shikam, develops new capacities of our desert threshold farming.



## 4 Circulating - Individualizing

What should be secreted out from your body, and what will be individualized by the inner forces?

To develop the individualization of the biodynamic movement in Israel, we face several challenges:

- The predominant Israeli agriculture is industrialized, super intensive, and segregated. There is hardly any traditional farming exsite. In such conditions how can we rebuild farm organisms?
- The global desertification line crosses Israel in half. How can we develop biodynamic farming in such conditions? How should the work with biodynamic preparation be in hyper desert?
- Israel is a geographical and cultural bridge - how can we bring this quality to our farming?
- As a young farmer-based movement, how can we develop the cultural side of farming, how can we have a community culture that supports the development of biodynamics?
- How can the biodynamic impulse relate and benefit from the agrarian history of the religions and cultures of the land: from Jewish, to Muslim, to Christian to Druze
- With biodynamics, we wish to heal the land through agriculture. Can such farming be a source of healing to the political conflicts in the region?



## 3 Digesting - Nursing

Nourishing our body and spirit comes via breaking down that which has come from the outside and transforming it largely in an unconscious way.

The biodynamic center Adama Haya had instigated several processes of digestion of outside processes. Their localization has given nourishment to the development of an Israeli Biodynamic movement:

- The development of a Hebrew biodynamic calendar via the support of the BhaiKaka Krishi Kendra in India.
- The production of local biodynamic preparation via the support of Briony Young, Tablehurst farm, UK.
- The production of biodynamic steering devices, the soil regenerators via the support of Brigitte Olson.
- Farm scale composting via the support of Roland Ulrich & Bruno Follador.




## 1 Breathing - Perceiving

"intake" from the outside world; Through the 12 senses the outside world streams in to us

From where was the impulse of biodynamics breathed into the land of Israel?

- The first breath, in the 1940' some pioneers were doing their way to Israel, as was reported in issue 7 of the Biodynamic Association of the USA journal.
- A 2nd breath developed in the late 70s - Kafar Rafael, an anthroposophic healing community, was founded near the Israeli desert capital, where biodynamics was a part of setting the community's agricultural activities.
- In the early 80s' Harduf, an anthroposophic Kibbutz, was founded with agriculture activities.
- A 3rd breath, In the 90s' till 2000: 4 biodynamic initiatives, Demeter certified: Harduf - R&D for biodynamic seeds, Gvulot, Maanit, Herot. They all operated for several years until they all fell asleep.
- A 4th intake from the world came in 2014 as Adama Haya was founded to make biodynamics accessible to any farmer in Israel. The first commercial biodynamic preparations and annual biodynamic trainer began.



## 7 Reproduction - Creating something new

The moment when an organism is creating something completely new, reproduction that is creating a new individuality and a replicate.

Observing the 7 processes of life as a way better to see the development of the Israeli biodynamic movement helps us to see the creation process that has developed partially consciously and partly unconsciously, and some of it all makes one feel it is alive! It has become a being of its own!

Will it stand sustainably on its two feet? Only time will tell. Once the Israel Biodynamic Association is founded, we will be a step closer to seeing: if we created a replica or if something completely new was created.



## 5 Maintenance - Practicing

To maintain that what was individualized, we need to practice moving it so that the nourishment settles in our body organs.

The first study and implementation group in 2014 sprouted biodynamic practice across the country, some by leading organic farmers searching for their next step, some by new initiatives starting with biodynamics from the beginning. Waldorf teachers and people in various healing and social initiatives have joined as well.



## 2 Warming - Relating

We have to increase our inner activities to unite ourselves with what we have taken in.

The Biodynamic study and implantation groups initiated at Salsila SCA farm and Adama Haya have started country-wide warming and relating processes to understand biodynamics in the Hebrew language and via the local realities of farmers and Waldorf school teachers.

The Biodynamics column in Adam Olam Anthroposophy magazine gave a public stage to biodynamic practice and thought. The first biodynamic winery in Hararsim started its activities and created a farming organism one can relate to.

# The Biodynamic Impulse in Belgium

## "You'll never farm alone"

### Pioneering in the 80's

In the brave stories of our pioneering farmers there was a big interest in biodynamics during the first years of organics. Partly because this is 'the original' but also because there was an organic distribution center that gave priority to DEMETER products.

When this stopped many gave up DEMETER certification and turned to organic, but kept the interest in the broader biodynamic inspiration. Some of these pioneers are now in the process of transition to the younger generation.

One of them inspired us for our baseline: "You'll never farm alone". This came from the deep conviction that every farmer always needs others like customers, colleagues, nature, animals and spiritual beings.

### Carrying the fruits of excellent training

A young generation has been inspired by the high quality training initiatives in Belgium: Landwijzer, Ferme de Larock, Francoise Urbain, ...

Not only have they raised a new generation of skilled organic farmers. They also integrated the biodynamic impulse in their visions and working methods. This created a profound curiosity into what biodynamics is or can be.

Different initiatives have been developed: peer review groups, reading groups, a yearly summer school, a winter conference, excursions to Dottenfelderhof, delegations to Dornach, ...

There are also smaller groups that practise observation on farms, make compost heaps on different locations, bee keepers and Steiner schools that practice biodynamics.

### Preparations generate curiosity

The last couple of years we see a renewed interest in the preparations.

While the pioneering farmers talk about preparations in a much more 'searching' way after many years of study and trying different practices. The younger generation of interns that we see on our farms comes with a lot of 'curiosity' about preparations.

The development from something 'difficult' to something 'interesting' also comes with a more free way of interpreting the essence of biodynamics.

This might have become possible because biodynamics has truly landed with its feet in the ground on some valuable farms in Belgium. That gives a new generation the freedom to discover biodynamics in a safe and open way.



### A small but brave country

Belgium has a multitude of organic and biodynamic organisations. With each region having its own organic, biodynamic and DEMETER organisations.

Flanders is connected to the Netherlands for its DEMETER certification and Biodynamic Association.

Wallonia is connected to France in the same way, while the German speaking part of Belgium is connected to Luxembourg.

The 100th anniversary has inspired some of us to look for more connections between the regions, with the biodynamic impulse as a lingua franca.

### Diversity in products and farms

Belgium has the full scale of biodynamic farms and products.

Most are small-scale vegetable farms in the short supply chain (box schemes, farm shops, CSA, markets, ...). Some have cows, mostly for meat but there is also DEMETER milk and cheese in Belgium.

In West-Flanders we have DEMETER wine, in the most eastern province we have DEMETER flowers.

In the north-east there is WIDAR, which is one of the oldest biodynamic DEMETER farms in Belgium. This is a care farm where people with disabilities live in a number of small families. The farm has the objective of being self-sufficient with its own biodynamic grain, bakery, cows, milk and cheese.

Near Ghent a cooperative of 3 farms, De Vroente, works together for almost 20 years. These 3 farms exchange vegetables, agree on prices, organise training and exchange. They have a collective vegetable market in the city of Ghent. This cooperation is founded on the principle that 1 farmer always needs others.







The Association for Biodynamic Agriculture was founded in 1947 in Rome by the initiative of key figures in the Italian culture of the time. Among the most famous names were **Mario Garbari**, **Giacomo Feltrinelli**, and **Nello Aprile**. From the headquarters in Turin in the late 1970s, the headquarters moved to Milan thanks to the active contribution of **Giulia Maria Crespi**. Since 2022 the headquarters has been in Florence.

## HOW IS THE BIODYNAMIC IMPULSE ALIVE IN THIS ORGANISATION?

Since 2014 a strong impulse organized by our association with the 32nd International Conference of the association in Florence has seen a strong leap in quality, in participation that has involved the entire organic movement and produced historic changes in the philosophy of the movement that has gone as far as changing and producing better laws for farmers.

From 2018 to 2023, an intensive and innovative pre-brand verification service with at least one annual visit to 351 farms with access to the label for 134 of them. A service that has minimized the entry of problematic farms.

FARM COACHING for 2024 with a service free of charge in 10 Italian regions thanks to a project won by the Association and funded by the Ministry of Agriculture.





# Initiativkreis für Gemüsesaatgut aus biologisch-dynamischem Anbau



## ANFÄNGE DER SAATGUTARBEIT

Angeregt durch den 1924 in Koberwitz gehaltenen Vortragszyklus Rudolf Steiners kam bei einigen Landwirten und Gärtnern die Frage nach der Saatgutherkunft auf. Sollte und konnte es im eigenen Betrieb erzeugt werden oder zumindest biologisch-dynamischen Ursprungs sein? Im Getreidebau begann schon Ende der 1920er Jahre eine Saatgutarbeit nach biologisch-dynamischen Gesichtspunkten. Im Gemüsebau wurden erst in den 1950er Jahren einzelne Menschen aktiv, sie konnten jedoch die breite Kulturpalette unmöglich alleine abdecken.

## GEMEINSAM INITIATIV WERDEN

1985 kam es zu einem ersten Treffen von 18 Gärtnern und Landwirten zu der Frage, wie biologisch-dynamisches Gemüsesaatgut in größeren Mengen erzeugt und zur Verfügung gestellt werden konnte. Im Sommer 1987 bildete sich aus dem losen Zusammenschluss der „Initiativkreis für Gemüsesaatgut aus biologisch-dynamischem Anbau“. Verbindliche Vermehrungsabsprachen wurden getroffen und erste selbstgewählte Richtlinien für die Saatguterzeugung festgesetzt. 1988 fand sich in der Lebensgemeinschaft Bingenheim ein Ort, wo in rasantem Tempo eine professionelle Saatgutzentrale aufgebaut wurde. Gegenwärtig zählen etwa 75 biologisch-dynamisch sowie organisch biologisch wirtschaftende Betriebe zum Initiativkreis.




## SOMMER- UND WINTERTREFFEN

Von Anfang an fanden jährlich zwei Treffen statt. Ziel der Zusammenkünfte ist bis heute, eine stabile Basis für eine vertrauensvolle Zusammenarbeit zu entwickeln und sich gemeinsam fortzubilden. Auch die Hauptversammlung der Bingenheimer Saatgut AG und die Mitgliederversammlung des Vereins Kultursaat sind inzwischen fester Bestandteil.

## DIFFERENZIERUNG IN ZÜCHTUNG UND SAATGUTHANDEL

1994 wurde aus der Mitte des Initiativkreises der gemeinnützige Verein Kultursaat gegründet, unter dessen Dach Züchtungsforschung, Kulturpflanzenentwicklung und -erhaltung auf biologisch-dynamischer Grundlage stattfinden. Mit den Jahren machte der wachsende Saatguthandel die Gründung eines eigenständigen Unternehmens notwendig. So wurde 2001 die Aktiengesellschaft Bingenheimer Saatgut begründet.

# Die Buchausgaben des Landwirtschaftlichen Kurses

Die erste Auflage des Landwirtschaftlichen Kurses nach einem Stenogramm von Kurt Walther konnte noch Ende 1924 realisiert werden.

Für die zweite Auflage von 1929 standen Guenther Wachsmuth auch die Stenogramme von Lilly Kolisko zur Verfügung, wie u. a. aus seinem Vorwort von 1929 zu entnehmen ist. Die Einarbeitung des Kolisko-Stenogrammes in die zweite Auflage übernahm Ehrenfried Pfeiffer.

Die gedruckte Fassung des Landwirtschaftlichen Kurses wurde noch bis inklusive der dritten Auflage nur gegen Unterzeichnung einer sogenannten «Verpflichtungs-Erklärung» ausgehändigt. Das persönlich ausgestellte Exemplar musste nach dem Tode des Inhabers an die Naturwissenschaftliche Sektion zurückgeschickt werden.

Mit der vierten Auflage wurde der Kurs in die Rudolf Steiner-Gesamtausgabe aufgenommen.







Sonderausgabe 1929, textidentisch mit der 2. Auflage







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## Buchprojekt: Biographie

### Erhard Bartsch -

### Wegbereiter einer neuen Landwirtschaft



#### Wer war der Mann, der der biologisch-dynamischen Landwirtschaft den Weg bereitete?

Erhard Bartsch (geb. 1895 \*Breslau, Schlesien - gest. 1960 Klagenfurt, Kärnten)

war es, der die Willenskraft hatte, der biologisch-dynamischen Landwirtschaft zur Inkarnation zu verhelfen.

Er war nicht alleine. In Schicksalsgemeinschaft zündete der Funke, der zum Pfingstfeuer des Landwirtschaftlichen Kurses in Koberwitz wurde.

Im Mai 1922, an einem Sonntagnachmittag, es muss kurz nach Rudolf Steiners Vortragsbesuch in Breslau/Koberwitz am 13./14. Mai gewesen sein, trafen sich die drei jungen Mitarbeiter des Grafen Keyserlingk, Immanuel Vögele, Erhard und Hellmut Bartsch in der Wohnung des Rektors Moritz Bartsch in Breslau. Da entstand der Entschluss zum Landwirtschaftlichen Kurs.

In einem Brief beschrieb Vögele die damalige Situation:

Er hatte den Freunden Rudolf Steiners Antwort auf seine Frage, was von der Verwendung des Kunstdüngers zu halten sei, berichtet: „Es bleibt den Bauern ja heute nichts anderes übrig, als Kunstdünger anzuwenden, aber wenn in 20 oder 30 Jahren kein Ersatz dafür gefunden wird, wird sich die Menschheit vor immer größer werdende Ernährungskatastrophen gestellt sehen.“

Im weiteren Verlauf des Gespräches wies Vögele darauf hin, dass sie als Landwirte aber auch einen Kurs ähnlich der Pädagogen, Ärzte, usw. bräuchten. „Mir ist noch gut in Erinnerung, wie Du (Erhard Bartsch) auf meine mehr betrachtend-fragende Haltung, spontan und impulsiv reagiertest und in dem Sinne erwideretest: Gehen wir doch darauf zu und packen es an!“

Und so war es: Erhard war federführend. Durch einen Aufruf unter Landwirten innerhalb der Anthroposophischen Gesellschaft, wollten Vögele und Bartsch eine genügende Anzahl von Landwirten sammeln, die wie sie, so schrieben sie, „den Wunsch und die Überzeugung haben, von Herrn Dr. Steiner in grundsätzlichen Fragen ihres Berufs gefördert zu werden, und den Willen bekunden, die von Herrn Dr. Steiner kommenden Anregungen sowohl durch persönliche Weiterarbeit, als auch durch einen entsprechenden Zusammenschluss wirksam werden zu lassen“.

Es ging also um Fragen an Rudolf Steiner und um den Willen zum individuellen und gemeinsamen Tätigwerden aus einem geistigen Impuls im Praktischen.

38 Interessierte, darunter Ludwig Graf von Polzer-Hoditz, Gut Tannbach in Oberösterreich, und Otto Graf von Lerchenfeld, Schloss Köfering, meldeten sich im Laufe des Juni 1922. Ernst Stegemann, Pächter von Klosterhof Marienstein, antwortete interessiert, aber zurückhaltend und Graf Keyserlingk war noch nicht involviert.

Die Erwartungen, dass es noch in diesem Jahr, 1922, einen Kurs geben würde, steigerten sich zunächst, als Herr von Moltke, der bei „Der Kommenden Tag A.G.“, "Aktiengesellschaft zur Förderung wirtschaftlicher und geistiger Werte" mit Sitz in Stuttgart, beschäftigt war, ihnen im Juli 1922 mitteilte, dass er dies von Herrn Stegemann erfahren hatte. Daraufhin bat Erhard Bartsch von Moltke, die Vorbereitungen für diese Kursvorträge zu übernehmen. Diese Mitteilung erging an alle Interessenten. Außerdem entwarfen Bartsch und Vögele im Juli ein Schreiben an Rudolf Steiner, in dem sie die Bitte an ihn richteten, „getragen von dem uns von vielen Seiten ausgedrückten herzlichem Wunsche, von Ihnen das Notwendige zu hören,... einen Kursus über landwirtschaftliche Fragen in nächster Zeit abzuhalten“. Rudolf Steiners Reaktion auf das Schreiben, dieser Vorstoß wäre noch etwas zu schwach, „vorläufig wäre die Sache noch nicht tragfähig genug“, dämpfte die Hoffnungen.

Ende Februar 1923, gelegentlich der Delegiertentagung in Stuttgart, hatte sich eine Arbeitsgruppe anthroposophisch forschender Landwirte gebildet, mit Konradin Hauser vom „Kommenden Tag“ als Vorsitzenden. Rudolf Steiner wohnte der Gründungsversammlung bei und stellte noch für das Frühjahr 1923 einen landwirtschaftlichen Kurs in Aussicht. Die Brüder Bartsch und Vögele traten dieser Arbeitsgruppe bei.

Als aber von Stuttgart aus nichts erfolgte, ergripen sie nach längerem Abwarten erneut die Initiative, diesmal unter Beteiligung von Graf Carl v. Keyserlingk. Seinen vielfachen Bemühungen, d.h. seinem „eisernen“ Willen war es letztlich zu verdanken, dass der Kurs Pfingsten 1924 in Koberwitz stattfand.

In einem Brief an Konradin Hauser, Direktor der Landwirtschaftlichen Abteilung „Der Kommenden Tag A.G.“, vom 10. Oktober 1923 schrieb Graf Keyserlingk, der im September 1923 mehrere Unterredungen mit Rudolf Steiner wegen des Kurses gehabt hatte:

„Der ‚Kursus für Landwirte‘ findet in Koberwitz in der Zeit von Anfang Januar bis Ende Februar 1924 statt. Herr Dr. Steiner erklärte mir, dass die Wintermonate zur Abhaltung des Kurses die Geeigneten seien. Als Veranstalter des Kurses zeichnet die „Arbeitsgruppe anthroposophisch forschender Landwirte“. Die vorbereitenden Massnahmen werden bei stetem Gedankenaustausch mit Ihnen von mir durchgeführt. Herr Erhard Bartsch wird mir dabei behilflich sein.“

Der Termin sollte sich noch ändern wie so oft schon vorher und auch der Veranstalter. Veranstalter wurde schließlich Graf Keyserlingk und Vater Moritz Bartsch, beide als Leiter der Landesgruppe Schlesien der Anthroposophischen Gesellschaft. Erhard Bartsch war deren rechte Hand.


Er führte den Schriftverkehr im Auftrag des Grafen. Er besorgte die Vorbereitung des Kurses, die Versendung der Einladungen. Er organisierte Unterbringungen für die Teilnehmer, zahlte das Geld aus für die Saalmieten für die Abendvorträge in Breslau. Er leitete die Schutztruppe und Saalwache für Rudolf Steiner und vieles mehr.

Warum sich Rudolf Steiner 1922 der Initiative von Bartsch und Vögele gegenüber so zurückhaltend verhalten hatte, wurde den beiden durch einen späteren Hinweis von Günther Wachsmuth klar: „Rudolf Steiner würde es begrüßen, zu erfahren, ob und in welcher Richtung sich seine zukünftigen Hörer zu dem gewünschten Thema schon Gedanken gemacht haben.“ Das motivierte die Gruppe um Bartsch und Vögele, sich zu Studienabenden zu treffen, an denen nun ab Januar 1924 auch Franz Dreidax, Rudolf von Koschützki und Almar von Wistinghausen teilnahmen. Der Kreis reduzierte sich im Laufe des Frühjahrs, so dass ab März/April nur noch Franz Dreidax und Erhard Bartsch zusammenkamen, das aber fast täglich. Aus dieser Arbeit und den Zuschriften der Kursinteressierten ergab sich die umfassende Fragenzusammenstellung vom 1. Mai 1924, die Erhard Bartsch an Rudolf Steiner schickte.

Der Weg zum Landwirtschaftlichen Kurs war ein Weg des Willens.

Die Leistung von Erhard Bartsch dabei ist bisher nicht klar sichtbar geworden, denn „natürlich“ stand er im Schatten Graf Keyserlingks.

Auch im Märchen heißt es: „Mein Herr, der Graf...!“

# Wurzerhof, Kärnten - biologisch-dynamisch seit 1927

**1926** Im ersten heilpädagogischen Heim in der Schweiz, dem Sonnenhof, hatten Hemma, 23 Jahre, und Luise Wurzer, 21 Jahre, zwei Bauerntöchter vom Wurzerhof bei St. Veit an der Glan in Kärnten, Graf Ludwig und Gräfin Berta von Polzer-Hoditz, Gut Tannbach in Oberösterreich, kennengelernt. Luise Wurzer erinnerte sich: "Durch Vermittlung des Grafen Ludwig von Polzer-Hoditz konnten wir ganz nahe bei Basel auf deutschem Boden einen solchen Bauernhof (, der Mitglied des Landwirtschaftlichen Versuchsringes war,) besichtigen, sodass wir gleich begeistert davon waren. Durch die Einladung des Grafen und der Gräfin auf ihr Schlossgut Tannbach in Oberösterreich haben wir von Frau Gräfin Berta Polzer-Hoditz eine gute Einführung in diese Wirtschaftsform erhalten, ... Durch die Gräfin war es möglich **Feber 1927** an der darauffolgenden landwirtschaftlichen Tagung in Dornach bei Basel teilzunehmen,..."



So konnten wir schon im gleichen Jahr **1927** mit Begeisterung auf unserem Hof mit der Anwendung der Präparate beginnen, die Misthaufen sorgfältig mit Erde abdecken nach dem Präparieren und Präparate 500 und 501 ausspritzen. Dies alles war unserem Vater ungemütlich, denn dazu kam der gelegentliche Spott seiner Freunde über seine komischen Töchter. Als nun das Jahr darauf unsere dritte Schwester heiratete, zog sich Vater auf den alten großen Heimathof im Gurktal zurück, während unsere gute Mutter bei uns blieb.“ „(Sie) hatte noch einen Spürsinn dafür, dass „unsere Suche“ was ganz Richtiges sei und stand uns mit ihrem großen bäuerlichen Können treu und erfolgreich zur Seite und ließ uns gerne gewähren.“

**1928** begründete Graf Polzer-Hoditz den **Christian Oeser – Zweig** am Wurzerhof.

Der Wurzerhof wurde sehr bald **Auskunftsstelle für biologisch-dynamische Wirtschaftsweise** und **Lehrbetrieb** für Ländliche Hauswirtschaft mit sogenannten „Haustöchtern“ und Praktikanten.

**1935** wurde am Wurzerhof die „**Arbeitsgemeinschaft für biologisch-dynamische Wirtschaftsweise in Gartenbau und Landwirtschaft in Kärnten und Steiermark**“ gegründet mit 25 Mitgliedern und Luise Wurzer als Obmännin.

**1950** kam **Erhard Bartsch** zum Wurzerhof. Die Pflege des christlichen Jahreslaufes wurde zentrales Anliegen der Hofgemeinschaft und eines Freundeskreises aus der Schweiz, Deutschland und Österreich. Durch die pädagogischen und fachlichen Fähigkeiten von Erhard Bartsch wurde der Wurzerhof weit über die Grenzen als hervorragender landwirtschaftlicher Lehrbetrieb bekannt.

**1960** legte **Erhard Bartsch gemeinsam mit Karl König** den **Grundstein** für eine **anthroposophische Sozialtherapie**, d.h. die Verbindung von **biologisch-dynamischer Landwirtschaft und Heilpädagogik**.

**1964** Landwirtschaftlicher Lehrbetrieb und Anlehre im Rahmen der Sozialtherapie unter **Raimund und Johanna Remer, geb. Bartsch**

**1968 Gründung des Österreichischen Demeterbundes**

durch Initiative von **Raimund Remer und Marianus Rath**

Gründung der **Bauerngruppe Kärnten/Steiermark** durch **Raimund Remer und Dr. Leo Selinger**

**1964- 2016** Weiterentwicklung des Wurzerhofes als **Kulturstätte auf dem Land**

durch **Johanna Bartsch**: Saalbau, Theaterspiel, Konzerte, Feste, u.a.

Gründung einer Eurythmiegruppe, Gründungsimpulse für Waldorfkindergarten und Waldorfschule Klagenfurt und für einen Österreichischen Heileurythmieverband.

Pflege des landwirtschaftlichen Organismus, Aufbau einer Blondvieherde, Ausbau der Infrastruktur

# A portrait of Portugal 100 years after the Agriculture Course

Biodynamic Agriculture has entered Portugal in slow steps. We have searched and found footprints of its development since the 1970s until today. Here we present the lists of currently certified biodynamic farms, initiatives that promote Biodynamics in the country, study groups and share some precious vintage photos.

We are a volunteer working group that joined forces at the beginning of 2023 to prepare for the celebration of the Centenary of Biodynamic Agriculture by spreading word about the Agriculture Course in the country. To do so we are translating the 9th edition of Rudolf Steiner's Agriculture Course (to be launched during the festivities in June 2024),

we set up regional study groups, and organise monthly online meetings on Steiner's conferences. Among others, we collaborate with the Anthroposophical Society in Portugal and have received support from the Section for Agriculture at the Goetheanum.



### TERRITORIAL COMMUNITIES

The creation of various territorial groups of biodynamic agriculture in Spain reflects a **collaborative and diversified initiative** among farmers, producers, technicians and enthusiasts committed to the practice of biodynamics.

These **12 groups**, based in different regions of the country, are organized to carry out **periodic meetings, workshops, courses and research activities**, seeking to **promote and deepen** the application of **biodynamic principles**.

From meetings focused on the **joint elaboration of preparations** to initiatives to disseminate **knowledge and experiences**, these **territorial communities** seek to promote agricultural **sustainability** and the **integration of biodynamics** in different aspects of rural life in Spain.



### THE 12 TERRITORIAL GROUPS OF BIODYNAMIC AGRICULTURE CURRENTLY IN SPAIN



**AGRO CULTURA CON RESPETO:** Biodynamic agriculture group based in Cuenca and Albacete, made up of farmers, gardeners, livestock farmers, advisors, researchers, artists, bankers, teachers, processors and traders. They hold regular meetings, workshops, courses and fairs.



**FINCA EL OASIS BIODYNAMIC-DREISKEL-TERRADIANMICA:** Created in 2008. They hold annual meetings in spring and autumn for the theory and elaboration of biodynamic preparations.



**GRUPO DE PREPARADOS BIODINÁMICOS DE NAVARRA:** It holds annual meetings for the elaboration of biodynamic preparations in Navarra, as well as organizing workshops and training courses in Anthroposophy and Biodynamics.

**GINÉS GARCÍA ORGEA:** Organizes annual meetings in Huércal Overa and Chirivel for those interested in biodynamic agriculture.

**CATALONIA GROUP:** Formed by about 20 farmers, they meet every 3 months to prepare preparations and share experiences, especially in the field of wine, oil and orchards.

**GRUPO DE ARAGÓN:** Holds annual meetings in Aragón and its surroundings for the joint elaboration of biodynamic preparations.

**SURYA:** Association of Demeter certified biodynamic producers from different regions of Spain. They produce fruits, vegetables, olive oil, nuts and wines, as well as key inputs for biodynamic agriculture.

**Cel&Terra GROUP:** Created in Lleida in 2017 for the production of biodynamic and homeopathic preparations. They hold annual meetings in spring and autumn.

**ALMERIA DINAMIZA:** Group founded in 2020 in southern Spain, composed of farmers, entrepreneurs and technicians with experience in biodynamic agriculture. They organize meetings and face-to-face and virtual courses to promote biodynamics and anthroposophy.

**GRUPO DE PREPARADOS TIERRA DEL QUIJOTE:** Made up of 20 farmers, they meet to prepare CPP and carry out preparation tasks.

**GRUPO DE PREPARADOS SIERRA DE ALCARAZ:** Group of about 15 farmers who meet several times a year in Albacete to make biodynamic preparations.

**GRUPO TERRITORIAL BIOOLIPE:** Group formed by 37 people, interested in biodynamic agriculture. They meet monthly for training and elaboration of preparations in Cordoba.

The Biodynamic Association drives the movement with the support of territorial groups throughout Spain, joining forces to bring the Agriculture of the present and future to new horizons.





The history of the Biodynamic movement in Hungary began in the mid-1930s on a farm in Western Hungary. However, the historical situation condemned the continuation of this spiritual and practical journey to a long and deep sleep. We had to wait until the 1980s for **Klára Mezei** to begin her work as a teacher of the biodynamic practise in small circles, almost in secret.

After the change of regime in 1989, she was free to teach the biodynamic principles, travelling to different parts of the country wherever she was invited, and from 1992 onwards she organised a Biodynamic Winter Course at the University of Agricultural Sciences in Gödöllő, which lasted several days every January. On her initiative, with the support of enthusiastic gardeners and farmers, the Hungarian Biodynamic Public Benefit Association was founded on 15 January 2000, of which she became Honorary President, and the position of President has been held since its foundation by Klára Mezei's son, **Mihály Mezei**, an agricultural engineer, later biodynamic farmer and Demeter conversion consultant.

The Biodynamic Public Benefit Association, now known as the **Hungarian Biodynamic Association (BDA-HUN)**. It is committed to educating and supporting farmers using the biodynamic method.

To achieve this aim the Association

- publishes books and publications
- publishes the Sowing Calendar by Maria Thun since 1984.
- organises biodynamic trainings
- is a member of the BFDI

To continue the tradition, the Biodynamic Winter Course was organised for the 32nd time in Gödöllő. In the past three years, the event was held at the local Waldorf school.

Every year, in spring and autumn, the Hungarian Biodynamic Association organises a Preparation Day, and during the summer, a barrel (CPP) preparation making course in Legénd, at the Pedagogical Farm of the Foundation for Biodynamic Agriculture.

In addition, to support the work of Demeter farmers, the Association has organised training courses on various topics by inviting speakers from abroad. These conferences, lasting a couple of days, have been held on Demeter farms around the country. The invited speakers were Thomas Lüthi, Peter Kunz, Jean-Michel Florin and Michael Weiler.

Today, there are nearly 7000 hectares of Demeter certified horticultural, viticultural and agricultural enterprises. Furthermore, there are more and more beekeepers, a cosmetics company, herb growers and many small biodynamic house gardens, which are linked to BDA-HUN.


# Holistic statistical approach in biodynamic research to understand the farm as a whole

One of the main priorities in and around science is to find a way to view the results of research projects (numbers and statistics) as a **reflection of living organisms** (e.g. farms) with individual and unique properties.


The figures and graphics show the compilation of **international biodynamic research projects** and results based on holistic, "more comprehensive" research that makes us evaluate factors ("multifactorial analysis") that affect a whole system. Well-known, **reliable research methods** let us evaluate systems from a sensible and holistic point of view. Using **holistic statistics**, associating mathematical and statistical tools, enables us to gradually grasp the **subtle effects of the biodynamic approach** on a system.

Results even show the **international collaboration** regarding the "vital" evaluation of systems, variables correlation, effect on the surroundings, and optimization of farming practices under individual conditions.




Biodynamic preparations effect on functional microbial diversity and soil microbiome




Effect of biodynamic preparations on vineyard soils in France





Comment l'impulsion biodynamique s'est-elle manifestée à cet endroit ?



### La formation longue en Biodynamie - BPREA 2 ans en France

#### Une formation par des agriculteurs pour des agriculteurs

Au début des années 1990, un groupe d'éleveurs et de maraîchers en biodynamie a initié la première formation qualifiante sur 2 ans en agriculture biodynamique. Une formation en alternance avec 2 fois 8 mois de stage pratique, créée par le MABD en partenariat avec deux Centres de Formation Professionnelle et Agricole (CFPPA) en Alsace puis en Anjou en 2014.

Aujourd'hui, plus de 30 ans après sa création, ce sont presque 400 stagiaires qui sont formés







Begleitet von 2000 Partnern und Sympathisanten ist L'Aubier seit 44 Jahren engagiert für eine freie, verantwortungsvolle und menschliche Entwicklung.



## Hof und Käserei

Mit der biodynamischen Landwirtschaft hat L'Aubier seinen Anfang genommen. Auch heute bildet unsere Milchkuhherde das Herz des Demeter-Betriebes von 40ha landwirtschaftlicher Nutzfläche mit einem der ersten Freilaufställe der Schweiz für behörnte Kühe. Teil des Hofs mit seiner lebendigen Architektur ist auch die Käserei, wo die Milch veredelt wird und sieben verschiedene Käsesorten, Joghurt und Quark entstehen. Neben der Milch produziert der Hof Getreide und Mehl, Gemüse und Fleisch, doch seine wichtigste Rolle ist die Verbindung mit dem Lebendigen, die wir täglich pflegen und die auch für Besucher spürbar ist. In diesem Sinne verstehen wir auch die Herstellung und Anwendung der biodynamischen Präparate, die in L'Aubier bezogen werden können.



## Leben

Nicht nur zu Besuch sein in L'Aubier, sondern hier leben und die Werte teilen? Das ökologische Wohnquartier „Les Murmures“ ermöglicht Begegnungen zwischen Jung und Alt, mit einem grossen Gemeinschaftsgarten und umgeben von biodynamisch gepflegter Landschaft. Die grosszügigen und hellen Wohnungen, mit natürlichen Materialien gebaut, sind auf die Bedürfnisse von Senioren ausgerichtet. Services der Auberge sowie die Unterstützung von Nachbarn ermöglichen, den Lebensabend zuhause in vertrauter Umgebung zu verbringen.

## Restaurant, Hotel und Bioladen

Die Produkte des Hofes und der Käserei werden gleich nebenan im Restaurant zu feinem, 100%-bio-zertifiziertem Essen zubereitet. In einer warmen und einladenden Atmosphäre sind gemütliche Momente und herzliche Begegnungen möglich. In unserem kleinen Bioladen findet man nicht nur die Produkte vom Hof, sondern auch alles weitere, was man für das tägliche Leben braucht. Die individuell eingerichteten Zimmer des Öko-Hotels versprechen entspannende Momente und ein Gefühl von Zuhause sein, die Säle ermöglichen kreative Seminare.



## Assoziative Wirtschaft

Zentral für L'Aubier ist auch, anders mit Eigentum umzugehen: Das Unternehmen ist nicht als Privateigentum konzipiert, sondern als Raum, der Freiheit und Initiative für das Gemeinwohl ermöglicht. Durch eine grosse Zahl von Partnern und Sympathisanten wird L'Aubier partizipativ finanziert. Aus diesem Saatfest, entstanden mit der Getreidezüchtung Peter Kunz, wächst das Getreide für unser Brot im kommenden Jahr.



## Akademie

Die Zukunft steht auch im Zentrum unserer Akademie, die Perspektiven eröffnet und Werkzeuge in die Hand gibt, um aktiv zu werden. „Oser l'indépendance!“ ist unser Ausbildungs- und Orientierungsjahr mit Kursen, künstlerischen Ateliers und Praktika im Unternehmen, das junge Menschen zur Initiative ermutigt. Die Ausbildung startet wieder im nächsten Oktober. Andere Tagesseminare führen ein in Themen, die uns am Herzen liegen, wie die assoziative Wirtschaft, ein neuer Ansatz für Geld oder die „föderalistische Haltung“. In der Bodenarbeit mit Pferden kann an der eigenen Präsenz und Authentizität gearbeitet werden.

## ... là où la vie circule !

L'Aubier est un site pionnier en écologie, agriculture biodynamique et économie associative, situé en pleine campagne à Montezillon, au-dessus du lac de Neuchâtel, en Suisse romande. Il comprend une ferme-fromagerie biodynamique, un restaurant 100% bio et certifié Demeter, un éco-hôtel, un magasin bio, un éco-quartier intergénérationnel, une académie ainsi qu'un café-hôtel 100% bio dans la zone piétonne de la ville de Neuchâtel. Accompagné par 2000 partenaires et sympathisants, L'Aubier est depuis 44 ans l'acteur engagé d'un développement libre, responsable et humain.



### Ferme-Fromagerie

C'est avec l'agriculture biodynamique que L'Aubier a commencé. Encore aujourd'hui, notre troupeau de vaches laitières forme le cœur du domaine de 40ha en Demeter, avec une des premières stabulations libres de Suisse pour des vaches portant leurs cornes. La fromagerie fait partie de la ferme et de son architecture vivante, où le lait est transformé en sept différents fromages, yogourt et sérés. Outre le lait, la ferme produit des céréales et farines, des légumes et de la viande, mais son rôle le plus important est sans doute le lien avec le vivant que nous entretenons tous les jours et qui peut être ressenti par tous les visiteurs. Dans ce même sens nous voyons aussi l'élaboration et l'application des préparations biodynamiques, que nous mettons aussi à disposition d'autres domaines.



### Habiter

Pas seulement visiter L'Aubier, mais y vivre parce qu'on partage ses valeurs ? L'éco-quartier des Murmures rend possible les rencontres entre petits et grands, avec un grand jardin commun et un paysage cultivé en biodynamie. Les appartements, spacieux et lumineux sont réalisés avec de matériaux naturels. Ils sont adaptés aux besoins des seniors. Les services de l'auberge ainsi que les liens entre voisins forment un cadre qui permet de vieillir à la maison, voire d'y passer sa fin de vie.

### Resto, Hôtel, Magasin

Les produits de la ferme-fromagerie sont transformés en des délicieux repas dans notre restaurant certifié 100% bio où une ambiance chaleureuse qui favorise les rencontres permet de passer de bons moments conviviaux. Notre magasin bio bien fourni, offre non seulement nos produits fermiers mais aussi tout ce dont on a besoin au quotidien.

Les chambres de notre éco-hôtel, chacune avec son caractère individuel, promettent de beaux moments de détente et apportent le sentiment d'être chez soi. Différentes salles sont à disposition pour des séminaires créatifs.



### Économie associative

Pour L'Aubier, il est également essentiel d'adopter une approche différente de la propriété : l'entreprise n'est pas considérée comme une propriété privée, mais comme un espace qui permet la liberté et l'initiative pour le bien commun. Un grand nombre de partenaires et sympathisants participent à son financement. Cette relation entre partenaires, responsables et collaborateurs s'exprime dans une comptabilité transparente et ouverte. L'argent n'y est pas considéré comme une chose en soi, mais nous révèle un processus qui exprime une autre qualité selon qu'il s'agit d'acheter, de prêter ou de donner.

Les activités de L'Aubier sont coordonnées par les responsables des différents secteurs, qui soignent entre eux une culture de confiance et de transparence, en s'appuyant sur le partage des comptes d'exploitation.


### Écologie

### Académie

L'avenir est aussi au centre des formations de notre académie qui ouvrent des perspectives et donnent des outils pour devenir actif dans sa vie. „Oser l'indépendance !“, notre année d'orientation et de formation avec des cours, ateliers et stages dans l'entreprise encourage des jeunes à se lancer dans des initiatives. La prochaine volée commencera en octobre.

D'autres séminaires proposent des introductions dans des sujets qui nous tiennent à cœur comme l'économie associative, une nouvelle approche de l'argent ou l'attitude fédérale. Des ateliers avec des chevaux offrent un cadre de travail sur l'authenticité et la présence.

**Geschichte**

Der Betrieb wurde im Jahr 2007, in den Gebäuden der ehemaligen Kojosche «Freundschaft», von Ivan Boyko und Rainer Staxx gegründet. Er erlebte den ersten Herbst zusammen mit seiner Frau Svetlana Schuchina und zwei Kühen und zwei Hühnern in einer kleinen Baracke, die aus Holz gebaut war. Sie waren Gründungsmitglieder des örtlichen Kulturvereins und lebten in seinem Heimatdorf unterstellt. Diese beiden ehemaligen Betriebsfläche von 10 Hektaren wurden von diesen Personen gepachtet. Die Pacht wird in Form eines jährlichen Pachtvertrags erneuert. Seit dem Betrieb sind die Kühe und das Geflügel in einem sehr schlechten Zustand waren, mit Spülendenden, schlechtem Sehnen und die Gebäck. In einem solchen Zustand konnten die Kühe nicht abgekloppen. Dank großem finanziellen Engagements anfangs und der Maschinenteile im Acker- und Futterbau erneuert und erweitert werden. Seit letzten Jahr können wir die Hälfte der Getreideernte als Dementer Getreide in die Schweiz exportieren, was das Betriebsergebnis deutlich verbessert.

Geschichte

**Demeter Hof Schwa Semja Potutry in der Ukraine**

- Unser Hof befindet sich ganz im Westen der Ukraine in der hügeligen Landschaft der Karpaten. Zu unserem Hof gehören eine 400 ha Fläche, bestehend aus einer landwirtschaftlichen Fläche mit Tischen und Hügeln, mit Hecken und kleinen Wäldern und Strandwiesen, die direkt an das Felder, Hauwiesen und Weiden. Wir befinden uns hier noch nicht der Schwarzerdezone. Die Böden gehören dem Typ Grauer Waldboden an. Das Humusniveau kann hier nicht ein Meter erreichen, sehr auf vielen abschlüssigen Feldern ist sie jedoch infolge der Erosion deutlich kleiner, und wenig fruchtbar.
- Das Dorf Potutry selbst mit einem kleinen See, aus dem man einen wunderschönen Blick über die gesamte Landschaft mit den Karpaten bis hin zu den Karpaten-Hügeln und Weiden.

**Biodynamik**

Von Anfang an wurden mit Rainer Sax die, Spitz-, sowie die Kompostvariante hergestellt und angewendet, wann auch zuerst noch im Kleinen. Im Laufe der Jahre wurden die Mittelsteigerste immer mehr perfektioniert, von allen mit Hilfe der Market Eigenbaus verfügen, mit denen wir über unsere weitgedachten Felder fahren und sie segnen können. Es gibt auch einen schönen Dynamisperlat mit zwei 200 Liter-Fassern, die wir von unten und oben einem ebenfalls Fass mit einer elektrischen Rührvorrichtung. Das ergibt pro Tag 600 l. Tee. Pappkarton. Man kann sich aussuchen, wie oft wir röhren und drehen müssen, um all dies auf dem Segen zu halten.

**Kurz und Weiterbildung** auf bio-dynamischen Landwirtschaft in der Ukraine

Seit einigen Jahren führen wir auf dem Hof «Schwa Semja Potutry» unsere Präparatstagungen öffentlich durch. Dabei werden wir oft von Biodynamikern aus dem Westen durch praktische Hinweise, sowie durch Referate und bei der Erarbeitung des Landwirtschaftlichen Kurses von Rudolf Steiner, unterstützt.

**Verein, Biodynamika Ukraine**

Im Jahr 2018 wurde der Verein «Biodynamika Ukraine» gegründet. Als erste hat hat dieser Verein einen Einführungskurs in die Biodynamik organisiert. Zurzeit läuft der zweite Einführungskurs mit um die dreißig Teilnehmer. Er wird in Zusammenarbeit mit dem Verein «Schwa Semja Potutry» auf unserem Hof durchgeführt.

Seit 2022 ist der Hof «Schwa Semja Potutry» als erster Betrieb in der Ukraine Deinster zertifiziert.

We are developing paths to consolidate the national market for Demeter products through the implementation of the GSP scheme. We continue with the search for the commercialization of biodynamic products internationally.

In the 80s and 90s of the 20th century, the first farms were established, among which "Gabeno" stood out, founded by Helmut Von Loebell, and the first training courses in biodynamic agriculture were developed in the country, accompanied by such memorable people as Rene Piamonte.

In the year 2012, Ingo Mordhorst settled in Colombia accompanied by Reinhold Mordhorst, together with Brígida Valderrama and Jesús Antonio Giraldo, they embody biodynamic agriculture in Colombian territory.

In 2017, the Biodynamic Agriculture Association – Demeter (ABD Colombia) was born after the CONAGRECO Organic Agriculture Congress was held.

In 2019, the cooperation project of chambers and associations KVP (Kammer Verbands Project) was approved for ABD Colombia, which began its first phase in 2020 until 2022.

## MILESTONES OF OUR DEVELOPMENT



In 2023 KVP second phase began. During these years the Association began its development stage in different bodies: Training, Consulting, Certification, Marketing, Communication and Research, all supported by an administrative and organizational body.



# IMPULSO BIODINÁMICO DE MÉXICO

## SIGNIFICANT MILESTONES

### 1920

Finca Irlanda emerged, a coffee plantation in Chiapas, southern Mexico, with organic practices and principles as a foundation. It was until 1976 when Finca Irlanda got the Demeter certification which was the first one in all America. Nowadays is the home of our generations of agriculture and stewards of land who humble carry the roots of BD traditions.

### 1990

Relevant projects began to sprout with the biodynamic impulse such Rancho La Paz, El Equimite (veracruz), La Huerta de Vinci (San Miguel de Allende) and Las Canoas Altas (Michoacán), anthroposophical residence that has been actively receiving students and earth apprentices.

### 2018

The birth of The Association for Biodynamic Agriculture in Mexico, Impulso Biodinámico de México AC, was officially created in 2018. There were 9 founding members and the first general assembly took place the same year in Finca Irlanda Chiapas.

### 2019

The Association hosted the XXXIV Biodynamic Agriculture Festival of the Americas. In combination with the Latin American Conference as well as the Annual Mexican conference, in San Miguel de Allende. The event was very significant and welcome people and modalities for all around the continent.

### 2021

Collaboration with The council of biodynamic of Las Americas under the auspices of Biodynamic Federation Demeter International in the developing of the "Trainers of the future program" for Latin America. In addition to its continuous development, the current group of students of the Mexican training is carrying out a research and deepening project in qualitative methods hosted by ART (Advisory, Research and Trainig).

### 2023

The new board and roundtable of commissions was established.

Biodynamic calendar, Biodynamic preparations, Economy and fundraising, Liaison with educational gardens in schools, Liaison with agricultural organizations, International representation, Model BD Farms, Promotion and networking, Social Welfare, SPG Certification, Research and development, Training and education, Work and social events.





Die enigmatischen Entitäten des Siguas Tals lassen sich auf unterschiedliche Weise erkennen. Manchmal treten sie als ein stark beschädigter präkolumbianischer Weg auf. Manchmal manifestieren sie sich als ein fast zerstörter Steinofen, der vor 200 Jahren eingerichtet wurde, um Vollkornbrot zu backen, oder als abstrakte Felszeichnungen, die vor 3000 Jahren von unterschiedlichen (und anonymen) Autoren gezeichnet wurden. Inmitten dieser einmaligen Kulturlandschaft, voll von vulkanischer Asche, gedeihen uralte Feigenbäume hispanischen Ursprungs, die dank eines stillen Baches überleben könnten.

Die ferne Vergangenheit ist hier versteinert. Die Mobilität ist der Ausgangspunkt der kulturellen Hybridation des Tals und gibt Auskunft von „in Zeit verlorenen“ menschlichen Geschichten, die darauf warten, entschlüsselt zu werden. Der biodynamische Impuls ist vor kurzem hierhergekommen und erlaubt uns, die Vitalkraft einer alten botanischen Manifestation mediterranen Ursprungs ganzheitlich zu optimieren.

Die Wirksamkeit des biodynamischen Impulses geht aber weiter. Die Wahrnehmung der Kulturlandschaft lässt sich durch die ganzheitliche Landschaftsgestaltung intensivieren. Der Feigenhain und seine Umgebung sind ein Beispiel der harmonischen Koexistenz zwischen Kultur und Natur, zwischen Feigen arabischen Herkunft, alten Getreidesorten, Schafen und einem (fast) unbekannten prähispanischen Erbe. Dieser kleine Hof, der sich in einem archäologischen Tal in Arequipa befindet, gibt Auskunft über die friedliche (und freundliche) Integration von Impulsen aus fernen Ländern und aus fernen Zeiten und ist ein lebendiger und archäologischer Kulturvermittler, der jetzt die Ehre hat, die biodynamische Methodik zu beheimaten. Die Bedeutung dieses Betriebes und dieses kleinen, trockenen und engen Tals für die biodynamische Bewegung ist die Erweiterung der Wirksamkeit eines Impulses, der nicht nur alten Feigenbäume, Roggen und Weizen revitalisiert, sondern auch die Relevanz der archäologischen Manifestationen des Tals hervorhebt.

*Ghostly presences are repeated throughout this narrow and arid valley, whether in the form of a half-blurred pre-Columbian road, a boulder laden with symbols inscribed at the beginning of the first century, a clay oven anchored on the edge of a cliff, half-open tombs showing illegal excavations or centuries-old fig trees of Hispano-Arabic origin surviving on a trickle of water. Underneath, much longer inscriptions, traces of violent eruptions that occurred before the arrival of humans -and after it-.*

*Here, the past is petrified. The visual chronicle, composed of thousands of petroglyphs that manifest scenes of struggle, forms of life already disappeared, abstract models -signs of mental trance or mystical recollection and migratory flows -the true imprint of Siguas- gives a scope of the superimposition of veiled histories and biographies suspended in a buried memory. The biodynamic impulse has come recently and allows us to optimize the vitality of this ancient botanic manifestation (Mediterranean origin) and take care of the fragile biotopes in our farm, located in this sunny and dry valley.*

*However, the effectiveness of the biodynamic impulse goes further. The perception of the cultural landscape can be intensified through holistic landscape design. The ancient fig orchard and its surroundings are an example of the harmonious coexistence between culture and nature, between figs of Arab origin, ancient grains, sheep and an (almost) unknown pre-Hispanic heritage. This small farm, located in an archaeological valley in Arequipa, is a testimony to the peaceful (and friendly) integration of impulses from distant lands and times and is a living and archaeological cultural mediator that has adopted the biodynamic methodology. The importance of this farm and this small, dry and narrow valley for the biodynamic movement is the extension of the effectiveness of an impulse that not only revitalises old fig trees, rye and wheat, but also highlights the relevance of the archaeological manifestations of the valley.*

"The Beekeepers Year" is the name of our trial program for a biodynamic beekeeping foundation course. ## SOUND AND PHONETICS

What is in a name? Sound, magic, language and more. Hieroglyphs and sounds often share linguistic elements and layers of known and sometimes deeper or even hidden meaning.

**Te reo Māori:** *Maha*: Many - *Manu*: Bird or winged creature.

**Sanskrit:** *Maha*: Great, Superior, Noble, Light and Lustre, Abundant

*Ha*: God of fertility, later the symbol of the West.



# MĀHAM'HANU

## Antipodean Agrarian Alchemy

### PAST

New Zealand is a young country and landmass. The indigenous peoples consisting of the Māori and the lesser known Waitaha, have very little in recorded or oral history for our area. One Māori story for a nearby beach, Kairakau, speaks of a time when food was scarce. The oral tradition of Hinemahanga recalls a disastrous fishing season, during which the men decided to head inland to hunt for birds (out of season) while the women stayed on the coast. During this time the women continued fishing at Kairakau and were surprised by a good catch, which was mostly eaten in the men's absence. When the men returned, they were taunted for being outdone by the women. Chief Patea, Hinemahanga's husband, resented this and it is inferred that he pushed Hinemahanga to her death from the Kairakau cliff tops before fleeing. Hinemahanga's fishing net floats are said to have been perched into these rocks upon her death. Looking out to sea from the beach, this rock still bears the name Hinemahanga. A very sad tale in oral tradition.

Hinemahanga's tale represents the earliest known occupants of the Kairakau area, and is likely to be closely linked to when the first Rangitāne tribe settled in the area, prior to the Ngāti Kahungunu invasion of 1550.

To go back even earlier, New Zealand is believed to have been part of Mu an ancient landmass or set of islands which connects to a broader pacific oral tradition of Hawaiki (not to be confused with Hawaii). There is a strong connection with all areas of the Pacific and rich, detailed accounts from the Waitaha and Polynesian cultures. Hawaii in the North, Rapa Nui (Easter Island) in the South East and New Zealand in the South West, believed to form an equilateral triangle. The water was not seen as a barrier, rather a method of easy travel by the stars. It is interesting to me and has been suggested by others that rather than land, when broken down Hawaiki yields the following: Ha - tone, Wai - water, Ki - toward or into, Into or towards the tone of water... Is Hawaiki the fluid which connects and surrounds us rather than the land?

### PRESENT

A bare 3.5 hectare block of grassed paddock was purchased by my mother. Upon one of our first visits to begin the healing of the land, my mother and I were met with new life and death. Two wild Turkeys had been killed by a Hawk and left. The peeps of twelve baby Turkey poult filled the surrounding area, new life that we carefully collected and raised to size. The young Turkeys were again released once they would be able to survive on their own. The first of many birds. My partner and I had the privilege of getting to know the farm organism for a whole year - at home and in a very honest state. We had no running water, power or any permanent housing. The first thing we did was begin nutrient cycling, we brought on a Demeter certified horse cow and two calves. I spent the Winter months train, sun, snow and hail in a tent hand-milking; with no refrigeration, we provided the milk to the two calves as we began to rotationally graze and bring the animal impulse back to the land. When a house was built off site and moved into place we knew exactly where it was to go after a year of interaction with the land; along with the coming vegetable garden, area for the food forest and orchard, areas for herb and medicine growing, grazing all being slowly revealed to us throughout the four seasons before any action was taken. We are guided by the farm organism at all times as to where it would like things placed that work for all involved.

Test garden beds were planted and the stocking ratios and places for coming infrastructure slowly emerged in their own time. I have taken on the role of caretaker, storing and dispatching the Biodynamic Preparations for the New Zealand Association, and as I did so, the "M'hanu" (clay pot or vessel for holding medicine) distinguished itself from the "Maha" ("Manu" (many birds) and many layers of the spirit of place became even more grounded. As a Naturopath, Herbalist, Spagyrist and Medical Astrologer, the farm organism is working in collaboration with me in the process of healing humans, plants and animals; and through the Biodynamic Preparations and methods, the land.

### FUTURE

Good things take time, and in their own time they emerge with will from myself my mother and my partner who all live on the farm. Everything contributes. Chickens have revealed themselves as very well suited to the land, and its rejuvenation, among other animals and native birds also. The coordination of making the preparations is underway and dedicated beds for each of the botanicals have been marked out for planting. The hope from my mother partner and me is that not only can this farm organism sustain itself, but through the creation of the preparations, new explorations and experiments and play; we can also serve as a place of training and learning for anyone interested in the Biodynamic impulse. The organism will in its own time be able to fully express its highest potential and hopefully serve as inspiration for other people and organisms alike. If the organism is happy to have us for the duration of our lives we have already committed our lives to it. How to pass it on and who its' future kaitiaki (guardians) after us is not yet fully clear. We would simply be pleased to see the farm organism express its fullest potential and provide for the needs our family and local community in the meantime. The family unit all strongly believe that though demonstrating the Biodynamic methods and results attained and by providing education that hopefully the right person or persons will emerge with the same passion to take on the role of kaitiaki. A documentary focusing on the conversion journey and process, rewilding and reorganising in the Biodynamic way is in production. If anyone feels a connection, our farm organism it is very social to those of like mindedness. If a situation were to emerge to pass the organism on to the New Zealand Association or a Trust to carry on the enrichment of the environment, education of those interested in Biodynamics were available, this would be a future we hope for. With no one in the family to pass it on to after we pass over at present, we are always looking for the survival of the Biodynamic impulse. 

### HIEROGLYPHICS

Bridging sound and phonetics with form and symbolism are hieroglyphics.

Hieroglyphics have historically taken on multiple layers of meaning and symbolism. Which way they face affects which way they are read. Whilst we have tried to represent the true sound and layers of meaning as best as possible with Latin script alphabet, hieroglyphs had a deeper resonance with us. It was especially interesting to once again see the Owl present itself along with the Vulture. When approaching the farm there is to be a Triangular obelisk which shows Maham'hānu from the front two sides, whether coming from the left or the right to the property. This leaves the third side, visible only when leaving after experiencing the property to display the hieroglyphic cartouche. The hope is that once experienced the meaning, open with its various layers of interpretation and symbolism, can be experienced in as many ways as possible and to what ever degree the individual is ready to take on board.

Monique was introduced to Biodynamics in 2016, and it immediately made sense to her, with an innate understanding that everything is connected. Called to the land through her Saturn return, she has since intimately investigated biodynamics in many different climate regions throughout New Zealand - Bay of Plenty, Marlborough and Central Otago.

The invitation came to share her knowledge, and whilst currently co-creating on eight hectares of land that includes a market garden, orchard, pasture cattle and chickens, along with agroforestry and regenerating native bush, Monique teaches workshops in biodynamics and planting by the moon - enthusing a whole new collective of beings to the beautiful way of life that biodynamics creates, with a very practical, connected approach.



The biodynamic impulse is absolutely thriving in Monique and through her own learning, discovering, and teaching of the concepts, communities are being reinvigorated with the wisdom of nature.

The farm organism where she is primarily based contributes to the advancement of biodynamics, as a learning portal, not only for the family, but also the wider network of those wanting to explore holistic, ethical and ecological forms of interacting.
